

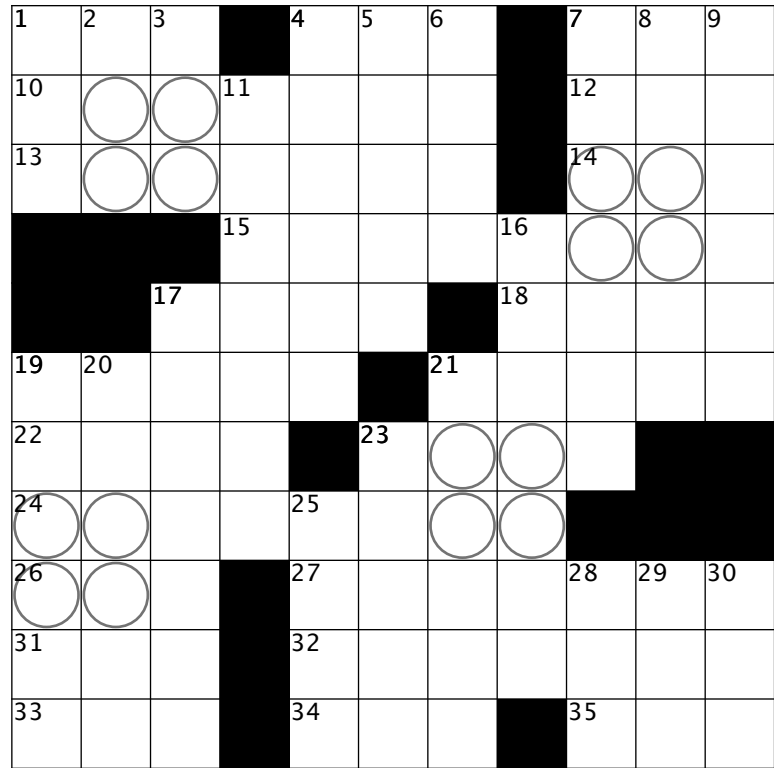
Enough Already
